WEST SOUND WATERSHEDS COUNCIL – LEAD ENTITY FOR SALMON RECOVERY

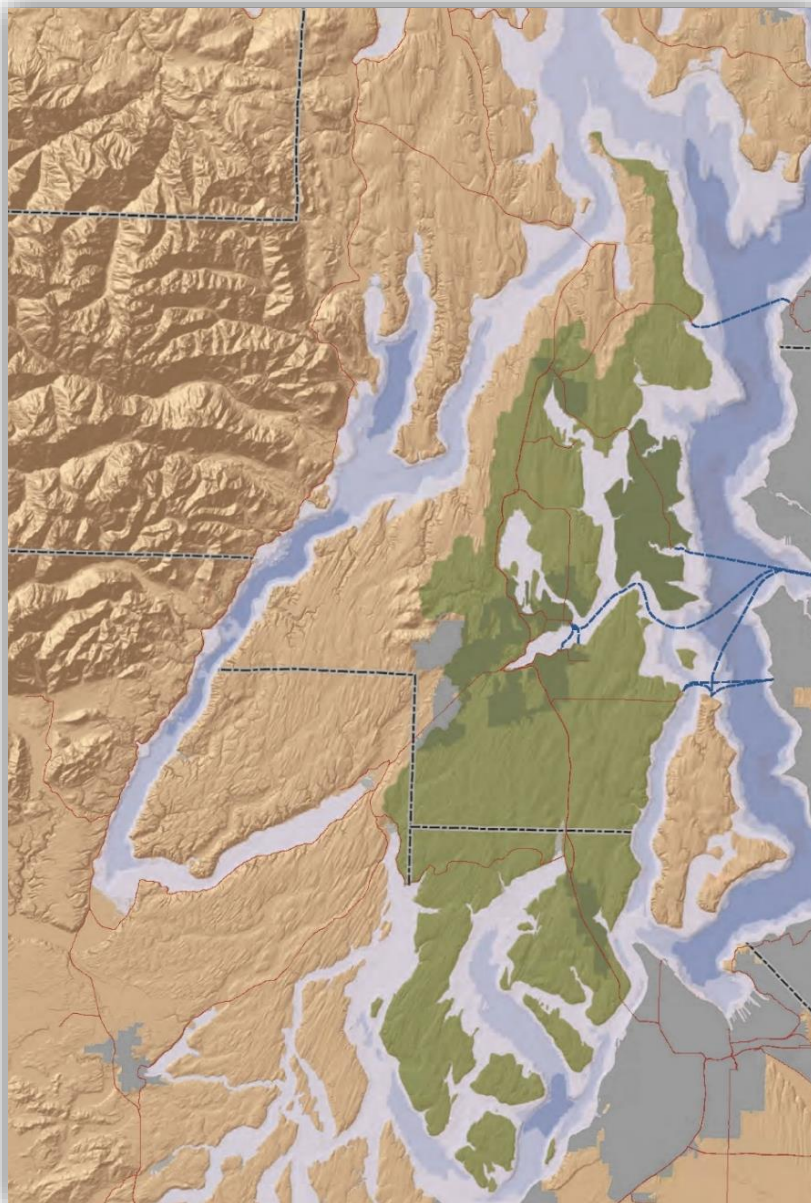
Lead entities are local organizations that develop local salmon habitat recovery strategies and recruit organizations to implement the strategies through habitat protection and restoration projects. Lead entities are funded by the Governor's Salmon Recovery Office.

The West Sound Watersheds Council (WSWC) was created by Kitsap County in 1999, in agreement with the cities, counties and tribes in east Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 15 noted in green on the map below. Hood Canal is its own lead entity for the remainder of WRIA 15. WSWC aligns salmon strategies with Puget Sound Salmon Recovery Plans and Southern Resident Killer Whale recovery plans.

Salmon Recovery lead entities assist with salmon recovery at the local level. This leverages local dollars, creates and sustains local jobs and maximizes the public's investment.
