Meeting Summary

June 18, 2014

Kitsap Conservation District

Attending: Kathy P., Tristan P.C, Renee J., Renee S., Paul D., Tom O., Carin A., Michael K., Aaron J., Teresa S., and Marian B. After group review of the agenda, the new Lead Entity Coordinator, Marian Berejikian was introduced.

Tristian provided the Puget Sound Partnership update -

- The Adaptive Management framework is done. He will send out the 70 page report.
- Next phase is indicators.
- Three year Work Plan was just edited. Projects that did not have a life (not able to complete in 3 years) were removed.
- Next year inventory of nearshore is funded (Foulweather bluff to Gig Harbor area). Will be in place by September.
- PSP budget cuts ranging from 5% to 25%.
- LIO overcoming barriers for project actions. Funding sources do not have good lens for projects that do not focus mainly on salmon as priority. Keep looking for other funds. Springbrook site.

Announcements and information sharing -

Aaron with Wild Fish Conservancy updated group on his group's work:

- Maps will be up soon on their website
- Data gap identified for Key Peninsula and Bainbridge, What watershed to cover next? Purdy Creek will be suggested. Maybe Curley Creek. Tribe is getting money to evaluate Curley Creek. Paul mentioned that WDFW will process samples for East Kitsap.
- Minter and Rocky Creek studies are done. Frank found steelhead on Key Peninsula. Was not able to get permission to conduct surveys on Manke Lumber property. They had their own property surveyed.
- Bainbridge Island surveys almost done.
- Kathy would like steelhead recovery information (who is doing what, what data is being collected) documented.

Paul with Suquamish Tribe updated group on anthropogenic shore marsh wood removal:

- Wood removal near Indianola is planned tentatively for Sept.
- Free wood for anyone who would like to take it.
- The Tribe is forming an advisory committee (Steve Todd) of 8 people. The TAG group would like to be included in this advisory committee.

Theresa informed group of Bremerton's *Don't Drip and Drive* campaign that will run from July through August.

Kitsap Conservation District staff provided a tour of Kitsap Conservation District property highlighting rain garden, low impact development and cistern features.
